Principal partners are National Geographic, International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC), the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) and, in Africa, the Didier Drogba Foundation.

Safe Schools



A capacity-building programme that equips students, teachers and governments to build education resilience against disasters across Southeast Asia. The Foundation also supports the Philippines’ Department of Education to develop a Comprehensive Safe School Ecosystem, potentially benefiting over 20 million students in almost 47,000 schools nationwide.

Early Childhood Development (ECD)

The Foundation supports several programmes to advance Early Childhood Development (ECD) in Asia:

The Best Start In Life, a new ECD programme in partnership with UNICEF, aims to develop a regional strategy aligned with the Nurturing Care Framework that focuses on the first 1,000 days, and to equip parents and caregivers with knowledge and skill to provide holistic care to young children, with pilot implementation in Indonesia.

The Foundation also supports two programmes implemented by China Development Research Foundation (CDRF): (1) Rural Education and Child Health, and (2) Nutrition intervention in rural schools.

First Read, in partnership with Save The Children, has provided literacy development and parenting skills to rural families in the Philippines and Cambodia between 2013 to 2019.



The Best Start in Life aims to reach 90,000 parents and children in Indonesia.

CDRF programmes support the development of **1,500 children**; and improve nutrition quality and standards in **121 schools**.

Over **330,000 children and adults** benefitted from First Read, with these children now having a higher chance of living healthier lives and completing their education.



PRUvolunteers

Prudence Foundation organises volunteering programmes in partnership with NGOs and local governments. Over the years our volunteers from more than 12 markets joined forces to support recovery initiatives in Indonesia (Padang/Lombok, 2009/2018), Japan (Tohoku, 2011), Thailand (Floods, 2011/12), the Philippines (Typhoon Haiyan, 2013) and Malaysia (Floods, 2015). PRUvolunteers have also helped build new homes and schools in Vietnam, Indonesia and Cambodia (2016 -2019).

Over **800 PRUvolunteers** across 12 markets have helped build resilient communities during **14 missions**

ASIA >> MYANMAR

COVID-19 relief programmes in Myanmar

Prudential Myanmar supported four different programmes:

- USD25,000 to ActionAid helped raise awareness in 3,457 households in Dala township, ensuring the COVID-19 emergency response reached the most vulnerable communities.
- USD15,000 to Doh Eain to support street vendors in Yangon during the pandemic with food donations, access to handwashing stations and distribution of PPE and sanitation kits.
- USD200,000 to Yangon General Hospital to improve hygiene conditions and manage the spread of disease by modernising sanitation facilities.
- USD20,000 to WaterAid to support communities with large migrant and daily wage workers in slum settlements, to improve access to sanitation facilities, grow public awareness around the pandemic and promote good hygiene behavior.

Building national capacity for COVID-19 risk communication

An additional USD20,000 was provided to support the "Family Hero Initiative", a national COVID-19 education and awareness campaign led by the Ministry of Health and Sports, WHO and UNICEF.

Targeting 12 townships in Yangon with the help of celebrities to maximise visibility and resonance through various media platforms reaching more than three million people.



AFRICA >> CAMEROON

PruBeLife helps disadvantaged communities and frontline healthcare workers in the fight against the pandemic

USD75,000 partnership with Value Health Africa (VAHA) focused on supporting the most vulnerable and high risk communities in the Cameroon who have little access to clean water, a lack of equipment and facilities to deal with the pandemic.

The approach focused on three areas:

- Raising awareness and tackling misinformation around COVID-19 prevalent across the country;
 - Provide support to schools, orphanages and frontline healthcare workers;
 - provide clean water to help against COVID-19 in most vulnerable communities.
- Reached over 1 million people.

AFRICA >> IVORY COAST

Providing clean water to disadvantaged communities through Value Health Africa (VAHA)

Through our assistance three boreholes were established in disadvantaged communities in the West, Littoral and Northwest regions of Cameroon as one of the key focuses in its COVID-19 relief campaign.



Early Childhood Development (ECD)

Helping children reach their full potential by enabling the best start in life

Context

- Approx. **250 million children** worldwide aged under five years in low- and middle-income countries risk missing critical development milestones due to poverty or stunting
- Investing in **early childhood development** (ECD) is one of the best ways a country can promote inclusive and equitable economic growth, and is cost effective. For every \$1 spent, the return on investment can be as high as \$132
- **Nurturing Care Framework**, launched in 2018 by WHO, UNICEF and Worldbank, focuses on the “first 1,000 days” from birth to 3 years old to make the most impact

Programme Impact

Our ECD strategy has evolved in two stages:

1. First Read programme promoting pre-primary literacy, working directly with families
2. ECD programmes aligned with the Nurturing Care Framework, focusing on the first 1,000 days of a child's life

Milestones achieved by First Read

- Benefitted over **157,000** children and **175,000** adults 2013-2019
- Programme is benchmark for Save the Children's educational ECD development work globally



Developed First Read with Save the Children, focused on pre-primary education (4-6 years old) in the most vulnerable communities

- Cambodia
- Philippines



Entered into 3-year partnership with CDRF in China, focusing on rural education and child health and school nutrition, as first foray into a more comprehensive programme



'Best Start in Life' behavioral change communications programme aligned with Nurturing Care Framework for parents & caregivers in Indonesia



Became founding member of China Children's Development Trust to further CDRF's work

Making a safe environment accessible for all children in our communities

Safe Schools



Context

- **200 million children each year** will have their lives severely disrupted by disasters
- We believe every child has a right to a **quality education**, in a **safe environment**, yet across the region many children are unable to realise this right due to the impact of disasters



Programme Impact

Our Safe Schools strategy evolved in 2 phases:

1. Launch at community level in five markets
2. Engineer a national pilot programme that could achieve greater impact and potentially serve as a model to scale up regionally and globally

1. Safe Learning Facilities
2. School Disaster Management
3. Risk Reduction and Resilience Education

Natural Disasters

- USD 1.1 trillion** economic loss from disasters in Asia

Road Safety

- Road crashes are the **#1 cause** of death of 15-29 year old
- 500 children** killed every day on the road

First Aid

- 80%** of accidents occur at home
- The **first 15 minutes** after an accident are critical

Making financial literacy accessible to all children




Context

- Poor financial literacy is a critical barrier to financial inclusion
- **Over two thirds** of the global population are financially illiterate
- Current education systems are not addressing this gap
- Women display lower financial knowledge than men in a large number of developed and developing countries
- By 2050, 80% of children will be living in Africa and Asia
- Children start forming habits and ideas about money by age seven



Programme Impact

Cha-Ching's components form a comprehensive ecosystem, enabling significant scale and reach



- Blended approach – digital, school and home learning
- Accessible to both rural and urban communities
- Wider benefits supporting teachers and parents in financial literacy

Cha-Ching distributed at scale

- 13** languages
- 35 million** households daily in Asia
- 87 million** views online (as of Dec 2020)
